A native New Yorker, Michael Pellettieri has been paintingand making prints since his youth. After graduating from the High School of Music and Art, he began—a program of studies at the NewSchool with John Ross followed by a full time program of drawing, painting andprintmaking at the Art Students League of New York. There he studied with HarrySternberg, Edwin Dickinson, Robert Beverly Hale and Joseph Hirsch.

Pellettieri started exhibiting his work in New York andaround the country in 1966. Hereceived a State Department Grant to travel and study in India in 1969, This wasfollowed by numerous awards in national and international printmakingexhibitions. In 1988 he wasawarded a MacDowell Colony Fellowship for printmaking. In 1991he received anaward for painting by the Ben and Beatrice Goldstein Foundation and in 2002 anBurr Miller award for lithography from the Society of American Graphic Artists.

He has been represented by The Associated American Artists, Weyhe Gallery The New Renaissance Gallery and is currently represented by TheOld Print Shop. His painting andprints have also been exhibited at the National Academy of Design and nominatedfor consideration for the Childe Hassam award in painting at the AmericanAcademy of Arts and Letters.

He has been teaching classes in printmaking, drawing andpainting at the Art Students League since 1977 and currently teaches acomprehensive class in printmaking. He taught printmaking at Columbia University from 1987 to 2006.
